Our route climbs a talus field to a tarn at 12,000 ft, then over a mild pass at 12,300 ft to the Crater Lake Basin. Then its a downhill bushwhack until we hit the Crater Lake Trail and return to Andrews Lake. If conditions allow, we may stop to explore the mysterious *black hole* in one of the talus fields.
